- Agile software development is a philosophy ... harder to resist than a methodology (because it makes sense!)




Agile philosophy that is driving changes to testing

- Short iterations testing must be done thoroughly and rapidly which can only be accomplished through automation
- Whole team quality no one wins if testing doesn't finish
- Emergent design need strong, rigorous regression testing to assure that an ever changing design does not break existing functionality
- Test driven development (aka test early) developers must test their own code for implementation errors

- It makes your software better!


